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This game can be played in pairs or with as many players you like at a time.

Each child takes it in turn to throw two dice.

Using these two numbers as digits they can make any number they like.

Eg. If a player throws a 2 and a 6, they could make 26 or 62, alternatively they could add the digits together to make 8, or subtract one from another to make 4, or they could multiply the numbers to make 12.

The player decides which number they will make and then claims that number by colouring in with their own chosen coloured pencil, alternatively they could place one of their counters on this number if they were using them.

The winner is the first player to cover three numbers on the number square in a row either up, down, sideways or diagonally.

The players should be looking to block their opponents as well as building their own line.
